At MSP, every person is valued and respected. We nurture the power to grow, working closely with each student to reach their fullest potential. Uniqueness is prized; self-discovery is essential.




Welcoming Environment

Humanistic Psychology

The Humanistic Point of View

Humanistic psychology is a contemporary and integrative school of thought focused on psychotherapy, education, theory, research methodology, and social responsibility. Humanistically-trained psychologists focus on the aspirations of individuals: their goals, fears, and potential for growth. Empathy, authenticity, and connection are emphasized in a therapeutic relationship that provides the catalyst for change.

During the first half of the twentieth century, American psychology was dominated by psychoanalysis and behaviorism. These movements did not fully acknowledge the qualities of human potential or the study of values, intention, and the meaning in human existence. A new paradigm was needed that recognized and celebrated the inherent value and dignity of all human beings. That paradigm came to be called Humanistic Psychology.


Humanistic Psychology emerged in the late 1950s with its first meetings held in Detroit. It was here that one of the Michigan School's founders, Clark Moustakas, met with Abraham Maslow, Carl Rogers and others to discuss the importance of integrating into modern psychology the humanistic principles of self-actualization, meaning, creativity, individuality, and being.

Central Tenets of Humanistic Psychology

These central tenets have been integrated throughout the Michigan School's curriculum since its founding in 1980.

At MSP, we're proud of our humanistic tradition and we continue to honor the values of humanistic and existential psychology established in Detroit so many years ago.





Academic Experience

The MSP campus is infused with the energy and intensity of graduate students engaged in learning. Masters, doctoral and certificate students from diverse backgrounds build lasting relationships that enhance their academic, personal, and professional experience.

The Master of Arts in Clinical Psychology (MA) program is designed for students who wish to become licensed psychotherapists. It is an applied program that emphasizes psychological theories and concepts along with clinical training that provides real-world experience. The foundational works of humanistic, existential, and phenomenological theorists and clinicians are integrated with other contemporary approaches to therapy. Graduates of the MA program meet academic requirements for licensure as a Limited Licensed Psychologist (LLP) in the State of Michigan.

The Doctor of Psychology in Clinical Psychology (PsyD) program is designed for students who seek advanced knowledge, skills and competencies in clinical psychology and a career as a Licensed Psychologist (LP). Utilizing the practitioner-scholar model, the program provides students with a broad foundation in theory, clinical training and research. An integration of humanistic approaches with current theories of practice is emphasized.

The science of ABA is to understand, describe, and predict behavior, instill behavioral skills, and reduce problematic behavior. This evidence-based technology is well established for the treatment of multiple populations, including autism spectrum disorders, developmental disabilities, and traumatic brain injuries. Students who desire a career as Board Certified Behavior Analysts (BCBAs) may take coursework in Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) as a stand-alone certificate or as a concentration in the MA program. Students In the MA program may incorporate these courses into their Master of Arts in Clinical Psychology degree with a concentration in ABA.



Faculty

MSP prides itself on maintaining an interactive learning environment facilitated by an accomplished roster of faculty who have clinical and research experience in health, neuro, multi-cultural, and social psychology, trauma, substance abuse, human sexuality, and psychological testing.

All faculty hold doctoral degrees and are committed to excellence in teaching and clinical work. Their engagement in private practice and other professional activities enhances the student's classroom experience. With a commitment to scholarship, faculty members conduct research, are editors or publishers in prestigious peer reviewed journals, present at seminars and trainings, and mentor students who are entering the profession.

A high priority is placed on individualized attention; faculty encourage students to conduct personally relevant clinical research and cultivate purposeful connections through social action and outreach.

The School was founded in 1980 as an institution of higher learning offering graduate degrees in clinical psychology with a humanistic focus. MSP is an independent, not-for-profit institution of higher learning committed to a tradition that transforms students' lives by preparing them through the study of clinical psychology to think critically, serve clients as psychologists and psychotherapists and contribute to a just society. Students receive experiences beyond the classroom through local practicum experiences and internships across the country.

MSP is known for its small community feel and its roots in humanistic psychology, for its strong academics and exceptional, personalized teaching. We have a dedication to service and an undying commitment to building a vision for the future, educating psychologists today who will transform our world tomorrow. MSP offers graduate degrees in clinical psychology to include a Doctor of Clinical Psychology (PsyD) degree and Master of Arts (MA). An Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) curriculum can be added as a concentration in the MA program or a stand-alone graduate certificate. Current enrollment is around 200 graduate students.

CAMPUS

MSP is situated on the beautiful campus in Farmington Hills, Michigan less than 20 miles from Detroit, a thriving metropolitan city. The carefully designed facilities offer open and welcoming surroundings that foster collaborative education. The campus consists of two buildings. Building A houses classrooms, the library, and administrative offices. The Diane S. MA students enter the program with academic preparation in psychology – many also have related work experience. PsyD students enter the program with a graduate degree and have a background of study in psychology or related field. ABA students enter the program with a graduate degree and have a background of study in psychology, social work, or education or they can enter as part of the MA program with a ABA concentration. MSP graduate students seek to become practicing clinicians committed to the humanistic principles and values of psychology.
